Mahendra Arts & Science College was established in 1999 and duly affiliated to Periyar University, Salem. The college has crossed many milestones on the road to its success. The institution was granted autonomy since 2015. The college is recognized u/s 2(f) & 12B by UGC Act 1956, Ranked by NIRF 151-200 BAND in 2021. To add a feather to the cap, the institution is recently accredited by NAAC with 'A++' Grade. The college has also secured 57th rank under Education World rankings among the best private autonomous colleges in India.

The college offers 13 UG programmes, 10 PG programmes, 8 M.Phil. programmes (Full time and part time) and 4 Ph.D programmes (Full time and part time). From the academic year 2019-20 onwards the courses have been reconstructed to implement Outcome-Based Education (OBE).
